



Annual Sports Report 2017-18

2017-18 has been a year of remarkable achievements for the Department of Physical Education and Sports of the College.

The Sports Committee for the year was constituted under the Chairmanship of Principal Dr Anuradha Roy and comprised Karthik K.S., Physical Education Director; Pushpalatha L.K., Intramural Secretary; and faculty members Sapna G.S., Allan Raj, Lokesh Y.R. and Shailesh G. Shankar, The Student Sports Secretaries for the year were Rakesh C. and Varshitha C.V. of III B. Com'H' section.

The Sports activities of the academic year began soon after the semester commenced in July with college team selections in Athletics, Volleyball, Cricket, Badminton, Table-Tennis, Chess, Throwball, Weightlifting, Powerlifting, Yoga, Taekwondo, Football, Basketball, Shooting, Archery, etc. being conducted.

The Department of Physical Education and Sports, celebrated the 3rd International Yoga Day on the 21st of June, 2017. The Chief Guest for the programme was Dr Y. Rudrappa, Founder, SDM Naturopathy. Dr Y. Rudrappa, spoke about yoga and uses of yoga in our daily lives. More than 100 students participated in this programme.

The Department organized the Bangalore University Inter-Collegiate Weightlifting (Men and Women) Competition 2017-18 on 6th and 7th of October 2017. The Chief Guests of the programme were Prof. C.M. Thyagaraja, Registrar, Bangalore Central University; and Prof. Lingaraju Gandhi, Registrar (Evaluation), Bangalore Central University.

The most awaited College Annual Athletic meet was conducted on 17th February 2018 at Central College Ground. The meet was a grand success with many events being conducted for students and staff members. Inter-Class Competitions were also conducted in various sports Cricket, Tennikoit, Football, Chess, Volleyball, Carom, Table-tennis, Badminton, Powerlifting and Throwball for Men and Women.

Most importantly, 2017-18 has seen many remarkable achievements in various sports. At the International level, 2 students participated and won 1 gold medal at the National level, 24 students participated and won 7 Gold Medals, 6 Silver Medals, & 4 Bronze Medals; at the All India Level and South Zone inter-university level, 16 students participated at the State level, 14 students participated and won 5 Gold Medals, 5 Silver Medals, & 5 Bronze Medals. Our students also won 59 medals at the Bangalore University Inter-collegiate competitions 2017-18.







To sum up, a total of 47 students competed at the highest levels and won 92 medals in variety of games including Chess, Athletics, Floorball, Karate, Taekwondo, Yoga, Boxing, Throwball, Air Rifle Shooting, Archery, Baseball and Netball, Powerlifting, Weightlifting and Softball. In another remarkable feat, the college Weightlifting, Powerlifting, Throwball, Netball, Softball and Chess teams have also won the prestigious Bangalore University, SET, and many more Private tournaments. And all this is in a college with very limited sports infrastructure due to constraints of space.

There are too many outstanding sports persons to present in detail in this report, but we would like to highlight the most outstanding of these achievers. Sujith C (2014-17 Batch) was given the best Sportsman of the year 2017 Award at the Bangalore University Annual Convocation. Sudarshan N won 1 Gold Medal at the International Level Yoga competition. At Throwball Competitions, Rakesh C won 1 Gold and 1 Bronze medal, Thanushree N and Harshitha S. won 1 gold and 1 silver Medal each. V.L. Harshitha and

Thanushree N won Silver medal in National Level Netball Competition Biju Modal and B.R. Nikkhil secured 1Gold, 1Silver Medal and 1 Bronze Medal each in National Level Floor Ball Competitions. Prateek Bharadwaj won 1 Silver Medal and Suhas S secured 1 Silver medal and 1 Bronze medal at National Level Baseball competitions. Shashank B.K. secured 1 Silver medal at the National Level Karate competition.

A record breaking amount of Rs.2,25,000/-(Two lakh twenty-five thousand only) has been distributed by our esteemed Management for participating at National and International level sports competitions. 

History

The earliest known softball game was played in Chicago, Illinois on Thanksgiving Day, 1887. It took place at the Farragut Boat Club at a gathering to hear the outcome of the Yale University and Harvard University football game. When the score was announced and bets were settled, a Yale alumnus threw a boxing glove at a Harvard supporter. The Harvard fan grabbed a stick and swung at the rolled up glove. George Hancock a reporter there, called out "Play ball!" and the game began, with the boxing glove tightened into a ball, a broom handle serving as a bat. This first contest ended with a score of 41–40. The ball, being soft, was fielded barehanded.

George Hancock is credited as the game's inventor for his development of ball and an undersized bat in the next week. The Farragut Club soon set rules for the game, which spread quickly to outsiders. Envisioned as a way for baseball players to maintain their skills during the winter, the sport was called "Indoor Baseball". Under the name of "Indoor-Outdoor", the game moved outside in the next year, and the first rules were published in 1889.

In 1895 Lewis Rober, Sr. of Minneapolis organized outdoor games as exercise for firefighters; this game was known as kitten ball (after the first team to play it), lemon ball, or diamond ball. Rober's version of the game used a ball 12 inches (30 cm) in circumference,



rather than the 16-inch (41 cm) ball used by the Farragut club, and eventually the Minneapolis ball prevailed, although the dimensions of the Minneapolis diamond were passed over in favor of the dimensions of the Chicago one. Rober may not have been familiar with the Farragut Club rules. Fire Station No. 19 in Minneapolis, Rober's post from 1896 to 1906, was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in part for its association with the sport's development. The first softball league outside the United States was organized in Toronto in 1897.

The name "softball" dates back to 1926. The name was coined by Walter Hakanson of the YMCA at a meeting of the National Recreation Congress. In addition to "indoor baseball", "kitten ball", and "diamond ball", names for the game included "mush ball", and "pumpkin ball". The name softball had spread across the United States by 1930. By the 1930, similar sports with different rules and names were being played all over the United States and Canada. By 1936, the Joint Rules Committee





on Softball had standardized the rules and naming throughout the United States.

By the 1940, fast pitch began to dominate the game. Although slow pitch was present at the 1933 World's Fair, the main course of action taken was to lengthen the pitching

recognition in 1953 when it was added to the program of the Amateur Softball Association, and within a decade had surpassed fast pitch in popularity.

In 1991, women's fast pitch softball was selected to debut at the Olympics. The 1996

Olympics also marked a key era in the introduction of technology in softball. The IOC funded a landmark biomechanical study on pitching during the games.

The 117th meeting of the International Olympic Committee, held in Singapore in July 2005, voted to drop softball and baseball as Olympic sports for the 2012 Summer Olympic Games, but will be back in the 2020 Summer Olympics in Tokyo.

Equipment

Ball

The ball is most often covered in white or yellow leather in two pieces roughly the shape of a figure-8 and sewn together with red thread, although other coverings are permitted. The core of the ball may be made of long fiber kapok, or a mixture of cork and rubber, or a polyurethane mixture, or another approved material.

In 2004, high-visibility yellow "optic" covering, long-used for restricted flight balls in co-ed recreational leagues, became standard for competitive play. Yellow is the colour of official NCAA and NAIA softballs. Yellow softballs are fast becoming the standard for all levels of play for girls' and women's play in particular. White balls are also allowed, but very uncommon in slow pitch and fast pitch.

Bat

The bat used by the batter can be made of wood, aluminium, or composite materials such as carbon fiber. Sizes may vary but they may be no more than 34 inches (86 cm) long, 2.4 inches (6 cm) in diameter, or 38 ounces (1.1 kg) in mass. The standard bat barrel diameter for both slow-pitch and fast pitch softball is 21/4 inches. Many players prefer a smaller barrel, which reduces mass and allows higher swing speed.

Gloves

All defensive players wear fielding gloves, made of leather or similar material. Gloves have





webbing between the thumb and forefinger, known as the "pocket". The 1st baseman's glove also has extra padding, but with finger holes. An outfielder's glove is smaller than the catcher's, typically 13 inches to 14 inches, but large enough to give extra reach in catching a fly ball. An infielder's glove is the smallest, typically from 11 inches to 13 inches. Its small size allows faster removal of a caught ball in order to throw with the other hand. A pitcher's glove can be of any size, but should be large enough to cover the ball, so that the batter cannot see the pitcher's grip on the ball.

Helmet

A helmet must have two ear flaps, one on each side. Helmets and cages that are damaged or altered are forbidden. Helmets



must be worn by batters and runners in fast pitch. Helmets are optional in slow-pitch. In NCAA fast pitch softball, you have the option to wear a helmet with or without a face mask. Most female travel ball teams for fast pitch softball require the batter to wear a helmet with a face mask. In male fast pitch masks are generally only used for medical reasons. In fast pitch, the catcher must wear a protective helmet with a face-mask and throat protector, shin guards and body protector. Shin guards also protect the kneecap.

Pitching

Play begins with the umpire saying "Play Ball". After the batter is ready and all fielders (except the catcher) are in fair territory, the pitcher stands at the pitching plate and attempts to throw the ball past the batter to



the catcher behind home plate. The throw, or pitch, must be made with an underarm motion: the ball must be released below the hip when the hand is no farther from the hip than the elbow to get it in the strike zone.

For fast pitch softball, the traditional pitching style is a "windmill" motion, extending the arm over the body and releasing the ball at about hip level at maximum speeds. Strength acquired in the underhand windmill motion is based from the open to close hip motion. Without correct form and hip movement, pitches can be inaccurate and can lose strength and speed.

Batters



The offensive team sends one "batter" at a time to home plate to use the bat to try to hit





the pitch forward into fair territory. The order the players bat in, known as the "batting order", must stay the same throughout the game. Substitutes and replacements must bat in the same position as the player they are replacing. In co-ed, male and female batters must alternate.

The batter stands facing the pitcher inside a "batter's box" (there is one on each side of the plate to compensate for either right or left handed batters). The bat is held with both hands, over the shoulder, and away from the pitcher (90-degree angle). The ball is usually hit with a full swinging motion in which the bat may move through more than 360 degrees. The batter usually steps forward with the front foot, the body weight shifts forward, as the batter simultaneously swings the bat.

Getting the batter out

The batter is out if: three strikes are called (a "strikeout"); a ball hit by the batter is caught



before touching the ground (a "fly out"); the batter goes to a base that is already tagged ("tagged" or "tag play"); a fielder holding the ball touches a base which is the only base towards which the batter may run before the batter arrives there (a "force out" or "force play"); or in certain special circumstances. There is also a not so common occurrence when the batter has 2 strikes and swings at strike three. If the catcher doesn't catch the ball, the batter has the chance to run to first base and the catcher can throw the batter out at first base.








Vikas Shive Gowda

Vikas Shive Gowda (born 5 July 1983) is an Indian discus thrower and Shot putter. Born in Mysore, he grew up in Frederick, Maryland in the United States. His father, Shive Gowda, coached the 1988 Indian Olympic track team. Vikas Gowda won the Padmashri Award in 2017.



He is an alumnus of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and the 2006 US NCAA National Champion in discus.

His personal best throw is 66.28 meters which is also Indian national record in discus throw, achieved in 2012. He contested at the 2008 Beijing Olympics but failed to reach the finals after finishing 22nd in the qualifiers, with a throw of 60.69 m. In 2012 London Olympics, Vikas qualified for the finals, at the fifth place, with a throw of 65.20 m and finished 8th in the finals.

He won his first gold medal in Asian Championships in 2013 in Pune, with a throw of 64.90 meters. In shot put his personal record stands on 19.62 meters.

His best moment came when he clinched the Gold for India in the 2014 Commonwealth Games with a throw of 63.64m, which made him the second Indian man to win athletics gold, 56 years after Milkha Singh, won the men's 440 yards at the Cardiff 1958 Games.

After the qualification standard was lowered, he qualified for the 2016 Olympics in the discus, making this his 4th Olympic games.

Floorball



It's a type of floor hockey with 5 players and a goalkeeper in each team. Men and women play indoors with 18-20m (59 – 66 ft.) wide to 36-40m (118-131 ft.) long which is surrounded by 50cm height enclosed boards and 96-115.5cm long (37.8-45.5 in) sticks and a 22-23cm circumference (8.7-9.1 in) plastic ball with holes. It's also called as indoor bandy, innebandy, Sala bandy and also unihockey. Matches are played in three quarters 20 minutes of period each. Floorball was included in the World Games for first time in 2017 in Wroclaw, Poland. Sweden were the 1st World Games goal medal winners. The basic rules

were established in 1979. There are also many competitions conducted from International Floorball Federation (IFF) namely Canada Cup, USA Cup, NAFC (North America Championship). Ozech Open, Champions Cup, Euro Floorball Cup, and Asia Pacific Floorball Championship. Asia Pacific Floorball Championship are played every single year in New Zealand, Australia, Singapore or Japan. The event was created by the Singapore Floorball Association together with cooperation of Asian Oceanic floorball conference. The sport is relatively new and therefore evolving.


